Abstract

The workshop aims to discuss and define a methodology for sustainable development of basins of big European rivers combining economic, organizational, technological and cultural issues in a perspective of interventions integrating river banks that in most of European big rivers are characterized by different levels of growth.

The development of European Big River Basins (BRB) such as the Danube, Po, Rhein and Volga will enforce the value of European approach to interregional cooperation. In particular the focus is linked to the implementation of a model of territorial governance based on an European perspective and to the improvement of a basic socio-economic knowledge and of a sustainable approach to ICT used in waterways control.

BRB represent virtual macro Regions and, although their relevance as commercial ways of transportation, they divide the territory in a variety of economic and business structures, cultural heritage and tourism opportunities, that are very often not integrated in a governance oriented to enforce the sense of citizenship of local communities.

For this purpose the workshop wants to examine the actual state of the knowledge in this field that changed very quickly in last decades. It also wants to produce recommendations, standards and evaluation systems for the performances control of organizations in charge of river basins governance in different fields.

The operative target of the workshop would be the start up of European research and applicative projects based on the collaboration among universities, research centers, central and local governments together with public and private organizations as main stakeholders of the river basins system.
